MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS

Prepare debris management plans ahead for all types (vegetative, C & D, MSW, special waste, HHW)

Pre-approved plans will get 80% reimbursement

New training available with possible grant funding

Lake Co. used special master with code violation citations to allow right of entry for tornado cleanup on private property (reimbursement)

Established a separate ESF at EOC for debris management to start early in process, continue after EOC shuts down

Discussed at summer SWANA meeting, input from Charlotte Co on additional needs:

Manpower for operating landfill compactors, with spotter training and LF experience

Manpower for SH, sorting area or cell – trained landfill spotter

Landfill compactor rental (including transport) – calculate a rental rate

Other manpower (with landfill experience) and equipment that is in public works resource list from FEMA

Fuel for equipment

Previous agreement element topics - handout

Each county needs to include a mutual aid rate for out-of-county: MSW, special waste, HHW

Two types of need

Disposal capacity for requesting county at an out-of-county landfill

Manpower, equipment, other resources to in-county landfill for requesting county

Draft mutual aid agreement – handout based on existing public works interlocal

Awkward revision considers disposal capacity only needs work

Emilio (Lake) and Scott (Hernando) will work on revising before next meeting

Susie will e-mail the draft documents to them.

FLOW CONTROL – changes since Supreme Court decision

Marion County drafted a modification to ordinance to implement flow control – BOCC refused

Marion County staff proposed universal collection – BOCC refused

No other changes proposed yet
Track any Florida test cases within the group

REGIONALIZATION

Study and funding

Citrus County has \$10 K in tentative budget, no questions so far

Hernando expects to be able to put some in

Seeking support from others, Susie and Karen will develop a draft scope for all to review

Look at cost effective waste-shed size for bioreactor LF, traditional WTE, thermal conversion

Presentation by Mark Halleen on several Wisconsin regional efforts – handout with lots of detail on process,

Without an “authority” – interlocal agreements

3 counties (BOW) for recycling

3 counties for (BOW) for disposal – sequentially use each other’s landfill capacity

3 counties SMP for disposal – close 1 landfill, switch 1 landfill to special waste, keep

largest as MSW

With an authority

2 counties each with 3 board members – landfill

Lead county with others as customers
